2022-23 BWS Year of Renewal

- 50th anniversary in 2021 During the 2021-22 school year which we dubbed our "gathering year," as we started to come back together in person, BWS celebrated our school's 50th Anniversary. Our school was founded in 1971 by pioneering teachers from the Rudolf Steiner School in Manhattan. (See Parent Handbook for the whole story.)
- Threefold Leadership Team BWS is a nonprofit, and for the school's 50th anniversary in 2021, our Board of Trustees initiated a governance change to keep up with our school's growth. After months of deep collaboration, our school has created a threefold leadership team with collaborative responsibility for the three overlapping realms of the school.

- Reaccreditation BWS is accredited by
 AISNE Assoc. of Independent Schools in New England
 AWSNA Assoc. of Waldorf Schools of North America
 WECAN Waldorf Early Childhood Assoc. Of North America
- Starting last school year and continuing through 2023, we are undertaking our dual re-accreditation for AWSNA and AISNE. This is a massive, all-school effort, through which faculty and administrators look self-reflectively at every nook and cranny of our school, a process that is informing our governance transition and policies and procedures. It feels like a lot, but it's symbiotic at the end of this we'll have a small novel!
- DEI Audit To support all our families, this spring BWS began working with Waldorf consultants
 Alma Partners to make sure everyone in our community is seen, heard and their needs are being
 met. Alma Partners is helping us examine our curriculum, festivals, environment and messaging
 through a complete DEI Audit, which continues this Fall.

Overview of Our Waldorf Year - Season of Courage, Season of Light, Season of Renewal At BWS, you will learn the magic of rhythm. Since we are outside a lot, we live by the rhythm of the seasons. (For a detailed look at the year, click here.)

- What will carry us, just as it carries your children, is the Waldorf concept of rhythm.
- Rhythm of the day, the week, the year.
- Consists of "in breaths" and "out breaths."
- Festivals in each season that support rhythm
 - Season of Courage (Fall)



- Michaelmas, Sukkot, First Nations Day, Harvest Festival, Homecoming, Holiday Handcraft Fair
- Bold, energizing, gathering strength
- Season of Light (Winter)
 - Lantern walk, Diwali, Hanukkah, Advent, Kwanzaa
 - Inner light and warmth to get through the long dark winter
 - Time of strong academic work, focus
- Season of Renewal (Spring)
 - May Day, Field Trips, class plays, Olympiad
 - Energy, planting, new growth
- Rhythm, with firm and loving boundaries, holds the students and holds us all together as a school community.
